16)Website

Had a call with the TeamSnap folks this morning. Possibly an opportunity to move from Goalline to TeamSnap for our main website, registration and the tournament module that Brianne implemented this season.

The club portion of TeamSnap connects with the HCR. You are able to bundle your subscription and purchase both accounts at the same time. Registration in the club platform will tie into the HCR, so once players register in TeamSnap, their info is synced to the HCR. It seems like it would make things easier for registration, posting schedules and allowing teams to communicate on one platform. Brianne mentioned there is a ref add on as well.

Below is the pricing email they sent.

The club platform cost is based on your team count. I recommend starting at a safe number of teams and then adding more teams once registration completes. This guarantees you are only paying for the teams you use. If you typically have between 12-14 teams, I would recommend going with 12 teams, then adding more down the line.

We discussed the Basic plan as being the best solution for the club and teams. Here is the <u>link to the features page</u> so you can see exactly what is included in this plan. The Basic plan will allow players to update availability, plus coaches can send messages out via push notification/text message. It's a solid platform for communication. You will also have access to a club communication tool to mass message teams or select divisions.

If you are processing registration through TeamSnap and using the HCR integration, then the \$249 admin fee is waived. We discussed this briefly on the phone. Payments are processed through Wepay currently, which offers a transaction rate of 2.79% + .99 cents.

12 teams Basic plan (\$249 admin fee waived): \$556 - which breaks down to \$46/team YouMake website builder: \$500

Total upfront cost: \$1,056

Websites are an add on option to the club platform. If you plan to build the site on your own, the cost is \$500 which renews annually. We do offer building packages as well should you need some help do to time limits. We briefly chatted over the WeBuild option. You have the choice to add this on down the line if you wanted to give the site a go on your own at first. I attached a PDF of this package for you to check out.
